

During the Financial Year 2023-2024, Regional Development Australia Mid North Coast worked with stakeholders across the region to produce a Regional Plan 2023-2026. This plan is available here.

Priority 4: Leadership and Collaboration



The annual action plans are contained in the Regional Strategic Plan. We update and publish our projects and advocacy areas for each financial year to ensure that the document is relevant and can be used to achieve accountability and transparency with our stakeholders.

RDA Charter – Regional Investment Framework

The RDA network has a Charter to operate within the Regional Investment Framework (RIF). The focus of the RIF is **People, Places, Services and Industries**.

Norfolk Island Highlights

Our work with Norfolk Island over the past financial year has been focused on understanding the unique needs of the region and working on opportunities.

We have been focused on the opportunities in the following areas:

- Reviving the cattle industry with new genetics for cattle and other small ruminants
- Food Systems Mapping and logistics
- Improving access to higher education and skills
- Supporting the business sector
- Developing the first Regional Plan for Norfolk Island to structure the direction of our efforts

- Connectivity



Table 1: Norfolk Island engagement by priority area




Our efforts in Norfolk Island have been focused on:

- Revival of the cattle industry and support of an assisted reproduction program
- Supporting the community to have greater access to post-secondary education with the Regional University Study Hubs program and the new Country University Centre Prospective Board
- Assisting with understanding the food system and other vulnerabilities for the Island.
- Infrastructure understanding the Council and industry's needs and supporting efforts to secure funding from available grant pools.
- Creating a unique identity for the Norfolk Island RDA with its own website.

Engagements by Sector

When viewed by sector, the engagement data demonstrates that our main focus area has been working with local government as the key stakeholder in the Shire for the priorities we've pursued.


Table 2: Norfolk Island engagement by sector

We serve the Mid North Coast of NSW and Norfolk Island. Our engagement activity is as follows, which results in a 55%/45% ratio of engagement.


Graph 1: Region specific engagement - actual


